Welcome to 5th Grade! Mrs. McClement's Class Disclosure 2024-2025

Class Expectations

Classroom expectations are the same as the Mustang 5. In this class we are family and we will have respect for each other as we learn and grow together. Students are expected to be respectful, responsible, and safe at all times. I will hold the kids to a high standard to make sure that our classroom feels safe and welcoming for everyone.

Mustang 5:

- Follow adult directions the first time.
- Keep hands, feet, objects, and words to yourself.
- Respect adults, peers, and property.
- Be prepared.
- Be where you are supposed to be.

Consequences:

- Redirect/Warning
- Delay on Passport
- Sideline conversation with teacher
- Logical Consequence
- Reflection letter to parents and loss of privilege
- Principal meeting

Rewards:

- Mustang Ticket
- First-class stamp
- Class activities such as free time, read-a-thons, and games
- Positive note, phone call, or email to parent

Daily Work

Work is to be turned in on time unless a student is absent. When a student is absent, the work will be provided, and students will have as many days as they were absent to make up the work. Late work is accepted; however, I will not accept late work one week before grade transmittal, and chronic late work will affect a student's work skills grade. I allow students to redo any assignment for a better grade- only the problems that were missed will need to be redone; the exceptions to this are quizzes, tests, projects, and presentations.

Homework

If students do not complete assigned work in class, they will be expected to finish it at home and return it the next day. When students do not complete their homework on time, they will receive a work delay on their passport. Work delays will be signed off once the missing work is turned in. Students are expected to **read for 20 minutes each night**, as well as **practice their math facts**,

watch math videos that will occasionally be posted on Canvas, or work on a math review packet. I will send home a calendar each month that the students will use to keep track of their reading minutes and math practice. This calendar needs to be initialed by a parent each week, and returned each Friday (or the last day of the school week) so that I can stamp passports. We will have a few long-term projects and reports that will require work outside of school. There will not be many of these, but expect students to have 3-4 this year.

Passports

Passports are our class incentive program. Students will receive stamps for at-home reading minutes, math facts practice, completing assignments, positive behavior, and anything else that I feel is deserving of a stamp. Students will not receive stamps for reading minutes and math practice if their calendar is not signed/initialed each week. Students will receive delays for incomplete assignments and/or behavior issues. I will write the assignment that is missing, below the delay stamp. If a delay is given for a behavior issue, I will write what the issue was below the delay stamp. Students may work off behavior delays by staying in for one minute of recess for each delay. Students may only work off one behavior delay per day. Passports must be signed by a parent at the end of each month. At the end of each month students will be able to purchase items from our class store with their passport stamps. Any delays that have not been worked off will be subtracted from their total stamps. Some months we will have a special destination activity where we will have a guest come do an activity or teach our class something interesting. Students must have at least 45 stamps to attend any destination activities that we may have. Students can not have any delays that have not been worked off, or they will not qualify to attend the destination. If a student does not make it to the destination activity, they will complete missing work, or write me a letter explaining why they did not get to attend, and what goals they will set to be able to attend the next month. New passports will be given out after each destination; stamps and delays will not carry over. Students must meet all criteria in order to participate in the destination activity. If a passport is lost, the student will not be given a new passport - meaning they will not get to shop in our class store or go to the destination activity if we have one. Students will only be given one passport a month, so they must be responsible for keeping track of it. Students are expected to be prepared with their passport every day. If they do not have it with them, they will miss out on the stamps given that day. Passports are one of the ways I communicate with parents, so be sure to check them regularly so you will know if your student is keeping up on assignments and behaving in class.
