Cell phone Policy:

According to the PTA, 6th graders should spend approximately 1 hour per night on homework. **However**, this year, I'd like to take a slightly different approach to my homework expectations.

I would like my students to spend this hour working on items that I consider to be *life skills:*

Math: According to the National Mathematics Advisory Board, math fluency is the number one critical foundation of algebra. The standards are clear: students need to master math facts before they can move on to more complex mathematical concepts.

My expectation is that students practice their math fact fluency each night. I will also be sending home different activities to practice their math facts.

<u>Reading:</u> I want students to read books *of their choice* for pleasure. With this in mind, they should spend approximately 25 minutes per night reading.

Additional homework may vary depending on individual students' needs and will vary with Fridays.

Mrs. Muno: HOMEWORK

These standards for homework during the year can vary according to student needs, please contact me over ParentSquare or Email if you have any questions or concerns.

Daily:

In order to keep up and maintain a language, research shows that the language must be practiced every day. This is why I want to make sure students are practicing listening, speaking, reading and writing Chinese (所说,读写) <u>every day</u>.

Listening: 10 minutes Videos over Canvas or any Chinese speaking movies

Speaking: 10 minutes Talking with anyone who also speaks Chinese (friends from Chinese class work too!)

Reading: 10 minutes I will send reading weekly passages to your students over canvas or on paper for students to read each day over the week

Writing: 10 minutes Writing will come attached to reading and will include either practicing sentences or writing their own stories Choice: 20 minutes I want students to love learning Chinese! They can choose their medium, and if needed check it with me. This can be any of the forms mentioned above or can include anything learning about Chinese culture.

Weekly:

I will send a weekly reading/writing packet (physical copy or assigned over canvas) where students will do their daily reading and writing, and then write about it at the end of the week due <u>Fridays</u>. They will be assigned on Mondays.

Monthly:

To make sure students are culturally literate as well, I have them prepare a short (5-10 minutes) presentation on something in Chinese culture. It is a great way for them to practice presenting as well as more deeply immerse themselves in culture.
